Brady's future with Bucs uncertain


TAMPA, Fla. (AP) - The Tampa Bay Buccaneers spent the past three seasons doing everything they could to try to help Tom Brady be successful.

If the seven-time Super Bowl champion retires or decides to sign with another team in free agency this winter, it will be important to have a plan to replace the 45-year-old quarterback.

Coach Todd Bowles acknowledges as much, although he's not providing much insight into how the Bucs are thinking.

And while there's no definitive timetable for Brady to let the team know how he's leaning, ideally the Bucs would like to have a better idea by the start of free agency in March.

'You want to have plans going into it. So we'll do our due diligence, meet with the parties involved and come up with a plan one way or the other," Bowles



said Tuesday, less than 24 hours after a 31-14 playoff loss to the Dallas Cowboys ended Brady's third season with the Bucs.

Tampa Bay enters the offseason with more than 20 players on the verge of becoming unrestricted free agents, including Brady and linebacker Lavonte David, who's been an important component of a defense

that helped the Bucs win the Super Bowl two years

David reiterated that while he'd like to remain with the Bucs, he won't rush a decision.

"Of course, you never know what could happen. I don't worry about it too much, though," the 11thyear pro, a team captain, said. "It's not up to me. I'll take time to just reflect, get my body right and see what I'm going to do from there."

Brady had little to say about his future after throwing for 351 yards, two touchdowns and a costly red zone interception in the lopsided loss to the Cowboys.

He briefly retired last February only to change his mind and return for a 23rd

"You always want every year to end great. Unfortunately, in sports it doesn't work that way," Brady said. "There are 32 teams in the league, and they're all very competitive, and only one of them is going to feel really good at the end of the

Titans hiring Niners' Ran Carthon as GM

(AP) — A person familiar with the decision says the Tennessee Titans are hiring San Francisco director of player personnel Ran Carthon as their new general manager, giving the NFL nine minority GMs among the league's 32 franchises.

The Titans interviewed their seventh candidate Tuesday morning in Buffalo senior director of pro scouting Malik Boyd.

The search committee headed by controlling owner Amy Adams Strunk picked Carthon, whose first interview was last Friday, according to the person who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because the Titans have not commented

on the hiring.

Carthon will be the first minority general manager for the original American Football League franchise founded in 1960 in Hous-

ton. He also will be the sixth minority among the past eight GMs hired in the NFL, which has held two programs since late May to promote more minority

candidates for front office jobs.

The 49ers will host Dallas on Sunday night in the NFC divisional round after earning the No. 2 seed.

Carthon joined the Niners as pro personnel director in 2017 and has been director of player personnel the past two years. Carthon also interviewed last year for GM jobs with Chicago and the Giants.

He was a pro scout with Atlanta between 2008-11. He played three years in the NFL as an undrafted rookie with Indianapolis between 2004-06. He played running back in college at Florida. His father, Maurice, both played in the NFL and coached with seven teams.

Tritons triumph in opener of Triton Baseball Invitational

The University of Guam Tritons had just 13 on the roster for the opening game of the Triton Baseball - UOG Endowment Foundation Invitational at the Triple J Baseball Complex on Friday at Okkodo High

But it was a strong 13, and the host team looked nothing like the team that finished in last place last year. The Tritons defeated the defending tournament champion Dodgers 6-3, using a big third inning and playing shutout ball to overcome the seasoned Dodgers.

"I'm just so proud of our team and their growth together especially being student athletes," said Tritons coach Roke Alcantara Jr. "Our team performed well. We made a few errors and mistakes but we stuck together and bounced back. Our team stayed resilient."

The Dodgers struck first with a run in the first inning on a two-out single by Mikey "Bats" Bautista that scored leadoff hitter Ryan Martinez. The lead would hold until the bottom of the third inning when the Tritons sent nine batters to the plate.

Kobe Martinez, Antonio Norita and Jathan Muna-Barnes all scored, on three singles and three walks, kicked off when O'Neil Yobech hit a sacrifice bunt to advance Martinez to second.

Starting pitcher Freddy Cepeda Jr. gave way to veteran Derwin Aguon as the Tritons threatened to break the game open. With the bases loaded, Aguon calmly struck out two batters to end the inning with UOG up 3-1.

The Dodgers tied things up in the fourth when Shane Muna and Shon Muna Ir. scored on a fielding error, and Tritons starter Larry Flores II got the Dodger muscle to fly out to end the inning.

Kobe Martinez scored the go ahead run for UOG in the fourth, and Andrew Perez and Dominic Pangelinan added insurance in the fifth. Pangelinan took the mound after Flores put runners at the corners with two outs.

'The Dominator'

Pangelinan ended the inning with a strikeout, and pitched to four batters in the sixth and final inning, allowing a harmless single by Muna Jr. to go along with three more strikeouts.

"We are already loving the new guy Dominic 'the Dominator' Pangelinan," said Alcantara. "He brings a high caliber of talent and experience to our program and we're thankful he made the transfer. We now can say we have a closer."

The game was called after six innings by the 2.5 hour time limit rule that is in place for the round robin stage of the tournament.

Flores picked up the win for the Tritons, pitching four and two-thirds innings while allowing four hits and walking seven. Pangelinan took the save.

Derwin Aguon picked up the loss for the Dodgers, coming in relief for starter Freddy Cepeda Jr.

Jathan Muna-Barnes led UOG at the plate, going 2-3 with 2 doubles and scoring a run. Antonio Norita also went 2-3 for UOG with a stolen base and a run scored. If there is no additional input, only need to update the GMHA and GMRC representative signature blocks. D. Burrier inquired if USNH is going to be part of the Diversion Policy and legally bound. Dr. Ross stated that USNH is part of the EMS system; therefore, its personnel need to know the dispatch requirements to continue to provide the mutual support necessary to assist in emergency transport. He further stated that the policy is very basic and does not include a hospital destination guide or a stroke diversion policy. The policy leaves the discretion to the EMS providers and general enough to allow diversion to the nearest facility. T. Manglona stated that there is still some confusion among the paramedics and is hopeful the new policy provides better clarity. Therefore, inquired about the practical application of the policy when both hospitals are on divert due to saturation, especially regarding Dr. Raetz's OMD. D. Burrier expressed the same concern and requested clarification. Dr. Ross stated that he was under the impression that	ESMC	1007	Approved Diversion Policy

TOPIC		dispatch is de-conflicting the diversions at multiple sites. If not, then the process should be reviewed to make it clearer. D. Burrier indicated that dispatch is keeping track of the diversions; however, sometimes the charge nurse is simply stating that the ER is on divert, without having the same knowledge as dispatch. T. Manglona suggested that more clarity at the hospital level to address the saturation issue. Dr. Ross suggested that as the RDC request is received that the destination hospital is also provided. D. Burrier suggested that in lieu of diverting every other patient consider diverting after two-four to allow hospitals to help alleviate its respective saturation levels. Dr. Ross suggested that we consider this proposal to as part of a quality improvement project. In response to Dr. Mendiola's question, D. Burrier confirmed that once the receiving hospital is informed that they are next for diversion, no one has been turned away. At GMHA, Dr. Mendiola stated that he would inform its staff to ask, "are we the next receiving facility?" and he would coordinate the same with GMRC. Dr. Haley-Wien stated it would be helpful to communicate when a diversion has expired. D. Burrier also stated that the EMTs could also preface their statement: we are on divert and you are the next receiving facility. Dr. Leon Guerrero agreed that both hospitals need to know when both hospitals are on-divert. D. Burrier stated that the hospital needs to inform GFD they are on divert, and GFD will inform the units; the hospital should also be communicated to the other hospital. Unfortunately, hospital personnel may become too busy to pass the word. Dr. Leon Guerrero suggested that there should be responsible persons assigned to communicate the status of divert.
