Dr. Mendiola stated that it has been his experience that there are very few incidents to indicate that there is a major problem in Guam. He stated that, although the protocol to address use of Naloxone has been updated, he is concerned with the medication being administered by untrained personnel, especially in recognizing the symptoms of opioid overdose versus those with other underlying health conditions in order to prevent patient harm (patients losing consciousness for other reasons, e.g., hypo-glycemia). In addition, he expressed concern with the side-effects of Naloxone especially if patients have other health-related issues. Z. Pecina provided an overview of the few incidents of potential opioid overdoses from 2015-2022. Dr. Mendiola further stated that, in comparison to the opioid problems in U.S. mainland, Guam does not have the same problems, e.g., EMS is responsive and has shorter travel distances to hospitals. 		<p>the low incident rates, he expressed concern of procuring medications that may not be utilized in a timely manner and would subsequently expire on-the-shelf.</p> <p>b. Dr. Leon Guerrero stated that he would need more time to review the proposed bill. In general, he would be interested in knowing who would provide the funding and who would be able to administer the medication. He stated that he would be more concerned with application of injectables versus a nasal spray; and suggested a study be initiated prior to the expenditure of funds.</p> <p>c. D. Mac McClung, NBA dunk champ, wasn't unknown

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Mac McClung was not exactly an unknown.

Long before he won the dunk contest at NBA All-Star Saturday, he was a YouTube phenomenon. It's impossible to add up all the views that videos of McClung — everything from dunks to documentaries — had gotten, but it was in the hundreds of millions.

Yet it all seems different now, after this 6-foot-2 boyish-looking guard from a small town in Virginia with

trampolines for legs and only two NBA games on his resume became the league's dunk champion and finally brought buzz back to an event that had been more criticized than celebrated over the last few years.

"He saved the dunk contest," Shaquille O'Neal said, and countless others echoed those sentiments.

Time will tell if they're right. But an event that is designed to create unforgettable moments — Michael Jordan taking off from the foul line, Vince Carter saying "it's over" after a dunk, Aaron Gordon jump-



ing over the Orlando Magic mascot, Dwight Howard donning the Superman cape — got a massive shot in the arm from a guy who now has more dunks in the contest (four) than he does in actual NBA games (one). "It's a cliché, but you can really do whatever you want to do," said McClung, who is on a two-way contract with the Philadelphia 76ers

and playing in the G League. "I've had so many people even at the highest level ... if you are a young kid, and someone who is an inspiration to you, someone that you respect so much tells you that you can't do it, it doesn't matter. Literally, if you manifest and put your mind to it, you can literally make your life and reinvent yourself

every day."

The reactions from NBA players watching the show, both in Salt Lake City and elsewhere, were amazing.

"Tough," Cleveland guard Donovan Mitchell shouted as he watched courtside, while several other All-Stars like Giannis Antetokounmpo — with his mouth open in disbelief — filmed the action on their

phones.

Golden State's Stephen Curry said on Twitter: "Man was a viral (House of Highlights) high school dunk phenom, still working his way to the League, but lemme go get that dunk contest trophy right quick and bring it back to life!!! Unreal."

McClung knows he is an underdog story. He grew up playing football and baseball in Gate City, Virginia, before deciding sometime around sixth or seventh grade — standing barely 5 feet tall at that point — that basketball would be his priority.

He started going viral in high school for his array of dunks, and he has handled all the attention that comes with internet fame as well as he can for years.

Love picks Miami, Heat also eye Zeller

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Kevin Love says he has picked the Miami Heat.

Love said Sunday that he will sign with the Heat for the remainder of the season once he clears waivers, a major add for a Miami team that is looking to move up in the Eastern Conference before the post-season begins.

"Miami it is, yes," Love said in a text message to The Associated Press.

Also Sunday, a person with knowledge of the matter said the Heat are finalizing plans to add another big man in free agent center Cody Zeller, with that deal expected to be completed before the team gathers in Miami to begin practice following the All-Star break.

That person spoke to the AP on condition of anonymity because Zeller's contract has not

been signed.

Love's decision was first reported by ESPN.

The 6-foot-9 forward and the Cleveland Cavaliers agreed to buyout terms on Saturday, ending his nine-year run with the team that he helped win the 2016 NBA championship.

Over parts of 15 NBA seasons with Cleveland and Minnesota, Love has averaged 17.2 points and 10.5 rebounds. He averaged career-lows of 8.5 points, 6.8 rebounds and 20 minutes per game in 41 games, almost all as a reserve, this season for Cleveland and didn't play in the team's final 12 games before the All-Star break.

That prompted buyout talks, and once they were done, Love chose Miami.

"It would give us another vet, another guy who's been

through the playoffs, another guy who knows what it takes to win and get to where we want to go," Heat center Bam Adebayo said.

Love is a five-time NBA All-Star, an Olympic champion and FIBA World Cup champion as part of USA Basketball, and his combination of size and 3-point shooting ability would seem to fit perfectly into the Heat system.

The Heat will come out of the All-Star break seventh in the Eastern Conference at 32-27, five games back of Cleveland for the No. 4 spot.

Miami will become Zeller's third NBA city. He has averaged 8.5 points and 6.0 rebounds in 494 games with Charlotte and Portland. The 6-foot-11 center was the fourth pick in the 2013 draft.

Tiger still thinks he can win

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Tiger Woods feels good enough to play at Riviera, his first tournament with a cut and without a cart since the British Open last July. He already is looking ahead to the Masters. And yes, he thinks he can win.

"I would not have put myself out here if I didn't think I could beat these guys," Woods said Tuesday ahead of the Genesis Invitational, which has attracted 19 of the top 20 players in the world.

He also is well aware

that he has not won since October 2019, and that at age 47 and with more surgeries than major titles (15), time is running out. He knows that. He's just not quite ready to accept it.

He marvels at how long Tom Brady lasted. He remembers when John Elway retired from the Denver Broncos because his body could no longer recover the way it once did. Golf is not a contact sport, but it has become a young

man's game. Only two of the top 10 players in golf are in their 30s. The oldest is Rory McIlroy at 33.

Woods can play. The question is whether he can compete, whether he can win. He remains at 82 career PGA Tour titles, a record he shares with Sam Snead, who was 67 when he made the cut at a PGA Championship.

Part of Woods was annoyed that he was celebrated for making the cut in the Masters last year, his first competition since a February 2021 car crash outside Los Angeles shattered bones in his right leg and ankle.

"I'm there to get a W, OK? So I don't understand that making the cut is a great thing," Woods said. "If I entered the event, it's always to get a W. There will come a point in time when my body will not allow me to do that anymore, and it's probably sooner rather than later. But wrapping my ahead around that transition and being the ambassador role and just trying to be out here with the guys, no, that's not in my DNA."

He played that ambassador role last year at the Genesis Invitational as the tournament host.
