“a lot of our players were without power or in the process of cleaning up. But I think it’s time. This event needs to happen,” he said.

Sablan said that the federation had lost track of some players in the storm’s aftermath. Federation leaders such as Sirena Cassidy went out of her way to reestablish contact with

members of the golf community to let them know about the rescheduled date. There is still time left, until 5 p.m. Wednesday, to register for the three-day event. A \$250 registration fee covers the play fee, lunch on the course and the awards banquet.

Also signed up to play is Ivan Sablan, who is scheduled to arrive in Guam on Wednesday. Sablan was tied for the lead after the first day of play last year but

went into the 80s on the final day and slipped to third place. Eduardo Terlaje did the opposite, spending opening day at 82 before two solid rounds in the 70s to claim second place.

Still he finished nine shots behind Camacho, whose 77-74-76 gave him the best men’s score of the tournament.

Joining the field are two other teammates Markus Nanpei and Anton Lacson. “Little by little the ex-

citement is coming back to golf. We’ve got some young players, some established players and by the time it rolls around, I think it will be a competitive event this year,” said Sablan.

Golfers will have to contend with the heat in addition to playing the toughest and longest course on Guam. CCP plays 7,400 yards from the black tees and often rewards long drivers with challenging approaches. But unlike last year, golfers will have a weeklong break between their second and third rounds. Golf is set for June 17, 18 and 24.

On the women’s side, Tyanna Jacot will be a daunting opponent to any golfer. She carded the best

score of the tournament last year. Her 74-71-72 was 19 strokes ahead of the next-best finisher Rose Tarpley.
