## Guam students place 3rd in National Japan Bowl

Students from St. John's School placed third in Level 4 of the National Japan Bowl, which was held virtually this year, according to advisor Fumiko Harada.

The school has participated in the contest since 2004, the highest score of which came in 2012, when then-high school students Franklin Lee, Allyson Chiu, and Dominique Ong, competed in Level 2 and placed fifth.

Now, captain Rachel Seo, Felix Gong, and Olivia Kang placed third nationally.

Two of the three team members competed in the virtual islandwide science

fair at the same time. According to Harada, the two students prepared for the competition 15 minutes before the live Japan Bowl contest.

"As you will see on YouTube, we were not prepared for the first three questions, which style was only used for the final round," Harada wrote in an email to Pacific Daily News.

But the students performed well in the rest of the competition.

In Level 3, captain Jonathan Pizzaro was selected as one of three winners in the conversation round. His teammates, Sean Yoon and Eunjun Shin, also competed.

With Harada, Yuko Stenson and assistant Miwa Gudmundsen led the teams.

"We are very proud and happy that Guam and St. John's Japanese program received nationwide recognition," Harada wrote.
