There may be changes in those directives and this will be reported if any changes to the next meeting. b. Noted, Dr. Agnon reported that she is the Chair of the Committee. Currently taking CDC guidance in consideration of opening operations to the new norm based on test positivity rates in the community. Currently all patients in ED continue to receive the swab regardless of vaccination status because of challenges of verifying vaccinations which will change when DPHSS comes up with a quicker verification process. GMHA will maintain vigilance at this time. 3. Guam Community College a. Noted, reports will be shared via email because D. Duenas had to leave the meeting early. 4. Guam Dept. of Education a. Noted, J. Quinene reported about COVID 19 vaccination outreaches, which will be finishing up on May 10. This will be ongoing. Pushing for CPR and First-Aid training. Also working with DPHSS to see how they can implement rapid testing and determine what other types of testing will be recommended in school settings even until the end of the school year (May 24). 5. 	<p>E. Ambulance Diversion Policy. The following summarizes a lengthy discussion on the Diversion Policy, which highlights some issues/concerns that require clarification to improve emergency care for the public.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Noted, Dr. Agyon questioned if the policy can be emailed for better reference and understanding in regards to a specific incident of stemi diversion. When that's called in, it's not a normal diversion on Guam, but it was acknowledged. What is the process to confirm that it's a true diversion? What happens when it's on a list of diversions that are not normally called in? - Noted, C. Chargualaf reported that every diversion in the past was mostly due to saturation or CT scans being out of service. - Noted, ED Saturation, Trauma Diversion, needs to be clear because there is a section on specific diversions so it would help to be clear to avoid confusion. - Noted, One issue that happens regularly is "acceptance" of patients to an emergency department. Clinic would call and speak to one of the physicians to let them know they want to send them there. Then the patient is brought to them not according to diversion policy but because the patient was accepted. Seems like the acceptance is overriding the diversion protocol. Not accepting them is basically an EMTALA violation. - Noted, everyone agrees that having the clinics call is preferred but emergency services are in a position where they are accepting some and not others. - Noted, it is important to clarify when it is an interfacility transfer or an endorsement. If the patient is going to an ER, then it is an emergency transport. There is no acceptance on the ER side - Noted, it will be important to be clear on the details in the policy but be careful not to be too specific because it could create an issue with flexibility if that's needed in the future. - Agreed, that it is necessary to develop a flowchart for the EMS providers to follow regarding the ER facility transfers, which will help in the decision-making process when transporting patients to an emergency room. Helpful information was emailed this morning to assist in creating these workflows. 	EMS	11:40	Tabled

IX. NEW BUSINESS	<p>F. Interfacility transfer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Noted, there are issues with interfacility transfers with Naval Hospital. Dr. Kinney was not present so no representatives from Naval Hospital were in the current board meeting. GMHA experiences a cardiac arrest en route to the Naval Hospital and they want to transfer them immediately at all hours of the day with no observation, no admission to ICU, they just want to transport on maximum pressures which is very unsafe and take a lot of resources when this happens. Dr. Agnon wanted to point out that they need a tri-hospital meeting because it has happened many times. - Noted, Board would like to clarify if Naval Hospital is under EMTALA or Humanitarian Effort. T. Manglona will converse with Dr. Kinney about this issue. - Noted, D. Burrer will help look for the official agreement between the Government of Guam and Naval Hospital. <p>G. Rules and Regs - Update including fees and fines</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Noted, currently they give certifications to EMT on island with no charge. This is currently in discussion with B. Sablan and K. San Nicolas will be pulled in to discuss with Legal Counsel to move forward to charging for certifications. - Noted, Asst AG Weinberg read the drafts earlier in the week and the first sections are copied out of the law. The Guam Compiler of Laws has specific numbering and format requirements for legal form. The process moving forward is the Board provide a draft document, agree preliminarily, have a public hearing, send the fees and rules to the AG office to approve as a formal legality, then go to Governor's office for approval and then to legislature for ratification. Another option would be to pay \$200 to go directly to the legislature. However, the Board will need to provide testimony on the fee structure (importance of a Treasurer). In regards to content and formatting, the recommendation is to have a subcommittee meeting to go over and discuss in detail. - Noted, the New Subcommittee will be led by M. Bell, C.
