Jan. 6 panel eyes interim report by summer 2022

The congressional committee investigating the deadly Jan. 6 attack on the U.S. Capitol is aiming to release an interim report in the summer of 2022 and a final report in the fall, a source familiar with the investigation said Tuesday.

The timetable, first reported by the Washington Post, would allow the committee to release findings before the November 2022 congressional elections. Republicans, who

generally oppose the Select Committee's work, are currently favored to reclaim control of the U.S. House of Representatives in that election, which would allow them to end the panel's work.

The House's Jan. 6 Select Committee is investigating the causes of the attack, including former President Donald Trump's actions and his efforts to change the results of the

Trump told the crowd of supporters he would never concede the Nov. 3 election and urged them to

"fight like hell" before they went to the Capitol, where lawmakers were preparing to certify Democrat Joe Biden's victory.

The committee has issued more than 50 subpoenas and heard from more than 300 witnesses in its investigation of the attack.

The panel has been working mostly behind closed doors, but its leaders have said they plan to hold public hearings in the months ahead. Deadly assault

Four people died on the day of the riot, and one Capitol police

officer died the next day of injuries sustained while defending Congress. Hundreds of police were injured during the multi-hour onslaught by Trump supporters, and four officers have since taken their own lives.

More than 700 people have been arrested in connection with the assault on the Capitol.

Court rejects group's argument that role in Capitol riot was protected free speech

WASHINGTON (Bloomberg) - The First Amendment right to free speech doesn't protect four leaders of the right-wing Proud Boys group from criminal charges over their participation in the Jan. 6 U.S. Capitol riot, a federal judge ruled.

The men were properly charged with conduct that isn't protected by the Constitution, including trespassing, destruction of property and interference with law enforcement all with the intention of obstructing "No matter defendants' political motivations or any political message they wished to express, this alleged conduct is simply not protected by the First Amendment."

Congress, U.S. District Judge Timothy Kelly in Washington ruled Tuesday.

The motion to dismiss was filed by Ethan Nordean, Joseph Biggs, Zachary Rehl and Charles Donohoe, who respectively led local Proud Boys chapters in Washington state, Florida, Pennsylvania and North Carolina, according to prosecutors.

"No matter defendants' political motivations or any political message they wished to express, this alleged conduct is simply not protected by the First Amendment," wrote Kelly, an appointee of former President Donald Trump. "Defendants are not, as they argue, charged with anything like burning flags, wearing black armbands, or participating in mere sit-ins or protests."

The U.S. Justice Department has charged more than 700 people with crimes stemming from the

riot, including dozens of members of right-wing militia groups like the Oath Keepers and Three Percenters who are making similar arguments in seeking dismissal.

Lawyers for Nordean and Biggs declined to comment. Lawyers for the other two men didn't immediately respond to messages seeking comment.

The Proud Boys, known for clashing with Black Lives Matter protesters and left-wing antifa rioters in Portland, Oregon, and other U.S. cities, describe themselves as a "pro-Western fraternal for men who refuse to apologize for creating the modern world aka Western Chauvinists," according to court filings.

Parents of girl shot dead by police call for justice

LOS ANGELES (Reuters) - The Juan Pablo Orellana Larenas, said in a parents of a girl killed in a clothing store dressing room by a Los Angeles police officer's stray bullet last week called for justice on Tuesday, the day after police released video showing the chaotic moments leading to the fatal shooting.

The 14-year-old girl, Valentina Orellana-Peralta, was inadvertently shot dead in a North Hollywood store on Dec. 23 when a police officer opened fire on a man who was bludgeoning another shopper after accosting and menacing several others.

The suspect was killed. But police said one round from the officer's rifle apparently pierced the wall of a fitting room where the girl was hiding, out of view, with her mother, striking the teenager in the chest. The girl, who had been shopping for a dress, died instantly in her mother's arms.

"It is like my whole heart has been ripped out of my body," her father, statement read by the family's attorney, Ben Crump, during a news conference outside of Los Angeles Police Department headquarters, "We want justice for our daughter. Valentina's life mattered."

The parents wept as they stood next to a wreath with flowers and photographs of their Chilean-born daughter. They wore signs around their necks that read "justice for my daughter" written in both English and Spanish.

The parents and their lawyers did not specify how they would like justice to

The parents described their daughter as an exceptional student who aspired to become an engineer.

'She had great dreams of becoming an American citizen. She wanted to be here in the United States because this was the land of opportunity," Crump

lury finds Theranos founder guilty of fraud

SAN JOSE, Calif. - A U.S. jury on Monday found Theranos founder Elizabeth Holmes guilty of defrauding investors in the blood-testing startup, convicting her on four of 11 counts.

Holmes was convicted of investor fraud and conspiracy, but acquitted on three counts of defrauding patients who paid for tests from Theranos, and a related conspiracy charge. The jury could not reach a decision on three counts related to other, individual investors

Holmes, wearing a gray suit. appeared poised after the verdict was read. A sentencing date was not immediately set.

Prosecutors said Holmes, 37, swindled private investors between 2010. and 2015 by convincing them that Theranos' small machines could run a range of tests on just a single drop of

blood from a finger prick.

Holmes rose to Silicon Valley fame after founding Theranos in 2003 at age 19 and became known for her penchant for wearing Steve Jobslike black turtlenecks. She attracted both high-profile wealthy investors including media mogul Ruperl Murdoch and high-profile board members. Her net worth was estimated at \$4.5 billion by Forbes in 2015.

She faces up to 80 years in prison when sentenced by U.S. District Judge Edward Davila but will likely get a much lower sentence.

Holmes was also charged with misleading patients about the tests' accuracy but was acquitted of those charges.

Holmes is likely to appeal, but

her attorneys and a spokesperson for prosecutors did not respond to requests for comment on Monday. The jury's verdict came after seven days of deliberations.

The case shed light on Theranos' failed endeavor to revolutionize lab testing. The company secretly relied on conventional machines manufactured by Siemens to run patients' tests, prosecutors said.

Theranos collapsed after the Wall Street Journal published a series of articles that suggested its devices were flawed and inaccurate. Holmes was indicted in 2018 alongside Theranos' former chief operating officer Ramesh "Sunny" Balwani, who had also been her romantic partner.

Balwani also has pleaded not guilty and will be tried at a later date.

Winter storm hits Washington as it moves across the **US East Coast**

WASHINGTON (Reuters) - A winter storm unleashed heavy snow and strong winds throughout much of the U.S. Southeast and mid-Atlantic on Monday, forcing federal offices and schools to close, grounding airplanes and knocking out power for thousands of people.

Forecasts called for 4-8 inches of snow and winds up to 40 miles per hour in the region's first blizzard of the season, according to the National Weather Service. Severe weather warnings were issued from the Carolinas to New Jersey.

As of 4 p.m., the National Weather Service reported that 8.5 inches of snow fell in Washington, D.C., 9 inches accumulated in eastern Tennessee, 14.6 inches dropped in Virginia and 15.5 inches was measured in Maryland.

"This is not a very typical setup for us, especially this time of year for us," said Austin Mansfield, a weather service meteorologist in Virginia. When we are talking highly populated areas, increasing accumulation of snow becomes problematic."

The National Weather Service said the winter storm was easing and would end by Monday evening.

The inclement weather forced federal government offices to close

in Washington, white dozens of schools across the region canceled or delayed the start of school.

Even President Joe Biden faced delays as he arrived back in Washington. The president and his staff were stuck on Air Force One for 30 minutes as plows cleared the runway.

The president's motorcade, which typically darts through Washington's streets, crawled on its way back to the White House.

The fresh snow did give children a chance to make forts and dogs could be seen diving in and out of the fresh powder.

Close to 200 people, summoned by the Washington D.C. Snowball Fight Association, gathered outside the Smithsonian Castle Monday

afternoon where snow was so deep it completely swallowed people's feet as they walked through it.

"Today we're letting it all loose against unsuspecting adults," said Vanessa Starks, a 38-year-old doctor as she threw snowballs toward people at the National Mall.

Power outages, accidents Elsewhere, the storm brought a fair amount of misery and problems.

Heavy snow accumulated on roadways and power lines, causing treacherous travel conditions and leaving homes and businesses without electricity.

Some 661,000 electric company customers were without power in Virginia, Maryland, the Carolinas and Georgia, Poweroutages.us reported.
