



VIII Legal Counsel's Report	<p>Asst AG Weinberg reported:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No further update on Lobofsky case; still under advice Draft of Rules & Regulations and Legislation are nearly finished, so he will distribute to the GBAHE for a final review, in anticipation of public hearings to be scheduled, beginning the last week of September 2022. He also outlined the approval process to include the requirement for an Economic Impact Statement, which will occur during the 4th Quarter CY 2022, and projects final approval during 1st Quarter CY 2023. This final review is for GBAHE members only until the final draft Rules and Regulations are promulgated publicly for comment. Furthermore, he stated that the draft takes into account the proposal for Podiatry and Physician Assistant specialties to be placed under the responsibility of the GBME; however, it is unknown at this time whether those professions would be extended a seat on the GBME. Asst AG Weinberg urged a unified approach when the draft R&Rs and legislation are presented to the public via the Legislature. In addition, he requested the GBAHE members inform the Chair and HPLO of their availability to support the public hearings. The Chair urged the GBAHE members to review their specialty areas in preparation for the public hearings and is hopeful that the Rules and Regulations will be approved as soon as possible since this has been a longstanding open issue. Checklist Requirements for Each Specialty – Dr. Miller reported that, upon review of application for Physical Therapist, he suggested that each specialty develop a separate checklist of requirements as it pertains to applicants, who graduate from foreign institutions since additional requirements may be required. For instance, in the case he reviewed, two additional actions were required: the applicant must also have a U.S. state license; and the course curriculum must be vetted by another agency in the U.S. In addition, he stated that it was important for the applicants read the local law to familiar with the requirements. Dr. R. Claros stated that he was familiar with the applicant, who was born and raised in Guam; however, he did not believe this was an oversight. He agreed that there needs to be better communication. Asst AG Weinberg agreed that since there are multiple disciplines under the GBAHE, he supported the recommendation to review the checklists for commonality; however, a separate checklists should be developed for each discipline, as required. He also encouraged the GBAHE members to review the HPLO website to ensure the information and requirements for licensure are clear.
