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## REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY GENERAL INFORMATION

### RDE Misuse:

Please refrain from using RDE or RD Eligible.

Over the years, CDR has stated in newsletters: CADE Newsletter, Student Scoop, and the ADA Times; that RDE is not a credential and should not be used. For the past several years students completing their supervised practice program must sign a RDE Misuse form for their program director regarding this fabricated credential. In addition, each student is provided with a copy of the misuse document to retain in their file. Anyone can file a complaint with CDR on an individual using RDE, RD Eligible, Registered Dietitian Eligible or RD if they are not registered as an RC with CDR. This would include RD in their e-mail address prior to passing the exam for dietitians.

RDE is the acronym for RD Eligible or Registered Dietitian Eligible.

### What does the term registration eligible mean?

The term *registration eligible* is used by the Commission on Dietetic Registration to identify individuals who have met the didactic and supervised practice requirements to write the registration examination. The Commission will verify upon request that an individual has met registration eligibility requirements and the eligibility date. The term RDE is not a professional designation/credential.

### Does the Commission recognize the professional designation RDE?

No. The term is not a professional designation/credential. The Commission has noted with concern an increase in the use of the term RDE to designate registration eligibility. Both employers and the public find the use of the term confusing.

We ask that you please discontinue the use of the term RDE or RD Eligible and replace it with registration eligible. Thank you so much in advance for your assistance regarding this issue.

In response to GMHA's inquiry on their hiring of Registration Eligible Dietitians and its affect on licensure to practice in Guam:

**As per 10 GCA Health and Safety, CH. 12 Medical Practices, Article 21 Dietitian or Nutritionist § 122102. Qualification for Licensure; Dietitian or Nutritionist**

To ensure we're on the same page, as per 10 GCA Chapter 12 Article 21, the individual must have passed the registration examination for dietitians administered by the Commission on Dietetic Registration to be qualified for dietitian licensure.

**10 GCA HEALTH AND SAFETY  
CH. 12 MEDICAL PRACTICES**

**SOURCE:** Added by P.L. 24-329 (4 Aug. 1998), (repealed and reenacted by P.L. 25-492 (Jan. 25, 2003))

**§ 122102. Qualification for Licensure; Dietitian or Nutritionist.**

(a) Licensed Dietitian. The applicant for licensure as a dietitian shall:

(1) Provide evidence of current registration as a Registered Dietitian ("RD") by the Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR), or

(2) (A) Have received a baccalaureate or postgraduate degree from a college or university, accredited by a regional accrediting body recognized by the Council on Post-Secondary Accreditation, with a major in dietetics, human nutrition, nutrition education, community nutrition, public health nutrition, foods and nutrition, or an equivalent major course of study as approved by the Board. Applicants who have obtained their education outside of the United States and its territories must have their academic degree validated by the Board as equivalent to a baccalaureate or masters degree conferred by a regionally accredited college or university in the United States;

(B) Have satisfactorily completed a program of supervised clinical experience approved by the CDR, and

**(C) Have passed the registration examination for dietitians administered by the CDR.**

Therefore, it is clear that merely being a "Registration Eligible Dietitian" or "RD-eligible" does not meet the qualification for licensure of a Dietitian.

Unlicensed Unpaid Volunteer Practicing.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Dr. Miller stated that his primary concern was volunteers "practicing", when a license is required.</li> <li>2) Dr. Claros stated that he was concerned with massage therapists adding treatment modalities that would require a license.</li> <li>3) C. San Nicolas stated that this issue came to her attention when reviewing a letter of recommendation, where it was stated that the applicant was a "volunteer" dietician. Although the individual subsequently was licensed, she suggested that a letter of concern be sent to the clinic and the individual, citing the 10 GCA – Unlawful Practice provisions.</li> <li>4) Dr. Miller also stated that, although student interns may be able to practice while under the supervision of a licensed professional, once a student graduates, they must obtain their license (i.e., would be unable to practice even if supervision).</li> <li>5) Asst AG Weinberg emphasized the importance for each GBAHE Board member to ensure the scope of practice for each discipline is clearly specified in the Rules and Regulations since they are responsible for monitoring the licensees within their discipline.</li> <li>6) In reference to massage therapy, the Chair informed the GBAHE that the Legislature has dealt with regulating this service for years; however, have yet to bring this issue to a conclusion, noting businesses advocated against it since many massage therapists have already moved to Guam from other countries and are currently working. The Chair stated that, although she personally supports regulating massage therapists, the Legislature would have to decide whether they will pursue this endeavor. In any event, she does not feel that massage therapy should be an added responsibility to the GBAHE. He further stated the Administrative Adjudication Act provides guidance on how to respond to questions. # NFL wants Watson indefinitely suspended

The NFL insisted on an indefinite suspension while Deshaun Watson's legal team argued there's no basis for that punishment as both sides presented their cases in front of a retired judge in Delaware on Tuesday, two people in attendance told The Associated Press.

The hearing will continue on Wednesday and Watson is scheduled to be there for the duration, according to one person who spoke on condition of anonymity because the hearing isn't

public.

Former U.S. District Judge Sue Robinson, who was jointly appointed by the league and the NFL Players' Association, will determine whether Watson violated the NFL's personal conduct policy and whether to impose discipline.

Watson agreed to settle 20 of 24 civil lawsuits for sexual misconduct, but the league is seeking at least a one-year suspension, one of the people told the AP. Watson's side, led by renowned attorneys Jeffrey Kessler and Rusty Hardin, wants the three-time Pro Bowl quarterback to play this season for the Cleveland Browns.

Two separate Texas grand juries declined to indict Watson on criminal complaints stemming from the

allegations.

Watson has denied any wrongdoing and vowed to clear his name.

This is the first hearing for Robinson, who was the first woman Chief Judge for the District of Delaware. Previously, NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell had the authority to impose discipline for violations of the personal conduct poli-

cy.

Still, Goodell holds considerable power. If either the union or league appeals Robinson's decision, Goodell or his designee "will issue a written decision that will constitute full, final and complete disposition of the dispute," per terms of Article 46 in the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

That means Goodell

could ultimately overrule Robinson's decision and give Watson one year or even an indefinite suspension due to the potential for more cases.

It's unknown how long it will take Robinson to make a decision, but the Browns should know Watson's availability before training camp. NFL discipline typically begins the week leading into the first regular-season game, so Watson would be eligible for camp unless a potential punishment stipulates otherwise.
