X.	<p>Old Business</p> <p>A. Reconsideration of Dr. Myung Han Ryu's Conditionally Approved license on September 24, 2021. Dr. Pomes stated that the applicant initially failed to provide all required documentation when he submitted his application for licensure. In response, Dr Ryu stated that he had been working on his VISA application so that he could work on Guam; however, he was unaware of the requirement to provide a state license for Guam's application; he stated that he subsequently submitted a copy of his GA license.</p> <p>Asst AG Wienberg stated that it is not uncommon for different jurisdictions to similar problems on which should occur first, a VISA or a state license. He therefore suggested that GBAHE and HPLO consider two application checklists: one for the applicant and one for HPLO to ensure all documents are submitted. These checklists will help ensure applications are not placed on the agenda for approval prematurely. S. Crisostomo indication that the checklists are in the process of being developed.</p> <p>In response to a query from S. Crisostomo, Dr. Ryu did not include his social security number. Pereda's concern regarding the lack of work history in GA, Dr. Ryu stated that the pandemic prevented him from actually working in GA, so he remained in South Korea, which explains why his work history was not annotated. The Chair stated that she also had some reservation in approving his application without a work history since performing to U.S. standards is required; however, upon read of the statute, there is only a requirement to provide a license from another state, i.e., no requirement to submit information on experiential history. Dr. Pomes stated that Dr. Ryu does have a work history in South Korea. Asst AG Weinberg that if supervised or experiential history is required, a change to the statute would be required. Tensions between US, China flare as Pelosi leaves Taiwan

TAIPEI, Taiwan (The Washington Post) — China escalated its rhetoric while U.S. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, D-Calif., visited Taiwan on Wednesday, calling her trip "very dangerous and stupid" and blasting the Biden administration for not stopping it.

"The U.S. government had the responsibility to prevent her trip. Yet they say one thing and do another. They have no integrity at all," the People's Daily, the official mouthpiece of the ruling Communist Party, said Wednesday in a front-page editorial.

Pelosi defended her trip during a news conference Wednesday, arguing that there is "a struggle between autocracy and democracy in the world" and that one of the purposes of the trip was "to show the world the success of the people of Taiwan, the courage to change their own country, to become more democratic."

She described Taiwan as a "model in this region," adding that it "offers a very strong contrast to what's

happening in mainland China," She said her visit "opens the door" to better economic exchanges and that several large Taiwanese businesses already plan to invest in manufacturing in the United States.

Pelosi departed Taiwan just after 6 p.m. local time following a visit that included a meeting with Taiwanese President Tsai Ing-wen. The U.S. delegation spent less than 24 hours in Taiwan, landing in Taipei just before 11 p.m. local time Tuesday amid a furious backlash from China, which considers the self-governing island

its own and views foreign diplomatic visits as legitimizing the movement for Taiwan's independence.

Despite the bluster from Chinese officials, China has limited its response to intensified military drills around Taiwan, as well as banning some imports of Taiwanese fish and fruit and barring Chinese exports of sand to Taiwan. China's army is set to conduct drills around Taiwan between Thursday and Sunday.

Yet the fact that the visit happened — and went off without trouble — is a success for Taiwan. The visit was a

test of Taiwan's diplomatic mettle and an opportunity to signal to senior politicians around the world that they can show support for Taiwan's democracy in person — despite vocal opposition from Beijing.

For Pelosi, who is third in line to the presidency and has served in Congress since 1987, the trip was a way to cement her legacy after a long and adversarial relationship with China that has often put her at odds with her Democratic colleagues. Her posture was at times viewed as unhelpful by those who saw her persistence as disruptive to U.S.-China relations.

Despite threats from Beijing and warnings from President Joe Biden's senior national security officials about the consequences that could follow a high-level visit to Taiwan, Pelosi remained undeterred.

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Salvation Army's new captains turn focus toward sustainability

Hector Acosta and his wife, Yasmin, are the new captains for the Salvation Army Guam Corps. The pair arrived July 9 from Seattle, where they were last appointed, taking over local operations from predecessors Kari and Eric Rudd.

Leadership changes occasionally based on need, Hector Acosta said the team in Guam is a "very high-caliber" group, and there doesn't appear to be any operational needs to address. Instead, Acosta has his sights set on sustainability.

"The questions I'm asking are these: What would happen if Salvation Army went away? What would happen to the community, and what gaps would pop up because of that? Or what gaps exist in spite of us being here?" he said.

"What I'd like to do is start developing ideas for solutions-based programs. What I mean by that is a nonprofit should not be at the mercy

of grants and funding and that sort of thing. Because that becomes counterproductive. So how do we become sustainable and how do we make that sustainability part of the strength of the community?" Acosta added.

The captain said he is in the "dreaming stages" with regard to initiatives, but added that he would like to share ideas and hopes to meet with stakeholders to develop solutions.

A low-hanging piece of fruit, as far as sustainability for the Salvation Army, is its thrift store. Acosta said there is a gap of about \$300,000 every year that he has to fill as part of the organization's operational costs. The store is getting to a point where it can pay for itself and, once it exceeds that level, it can start generating revenue to help cover overhead for the general operation, he added.

"I'm dreaming about ways to help by generating revenue for (Salvation Army Guam) for sustainability, so we're not scraping by each year. And then I'm dreaming about social enterprise so that we can create, like, micro-businesses," the captain said.

As an example, he wondered about creating a business to address issues around homelessness, such as a lack of housing inventory and unemployment.

"Like a microhome or tiny home manufacturing type of enterprise, and then hire (homeless individuals), train them to build the homes and then develop the village and then they lived in the village. And then they continue to do that for other people that are there," Acosta said.

"Not everybody would be interested in this particular job," he added. "But here in the community, there's tourism, there's certainly a ton of social services. We've got cars on the side of the road that I've noticed. ... So, what if Salvation Army developed a microbusiness, training a local to collect those and then figure out how to repurpose those vehicles? ... So, you take somebody who is a liability, and you actually help them start up a business. ... And now, you're solving problems on problems on problems. There are so many cool opportunities to do that."
