Budget was reviewed but was not finalized during May 28 and June 4, 2021 Workgroup meetings. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Next Working Group meeting will be held on June 18, 2021. No extension after June 2021. June 18, 2021 Workgroup Agenda: Need input for Investigator, Inspector, Administrative support, membership dues for Federated Association of Regulatory Boards (FARB), computer equipment, drug testing, stipend for Board meetings (12 or 13 meetings); on- and off-island training/conferences travel and support; internet costs, reserve fund (10-15%). HPLO ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT <i>Zennia Pecina, RN</i>	<p>The HPLO Administrator:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Supported the Treasurer's efforts and appreciated the financial template being used. Rules & Regulations need to be updated as soon as possible. Applauded GBAHE's effort that 90% is completed, which is far ahead of the other Boards. The Chair requested that the individual professions/disciplines provide input to their respective sections as soon as possible. 	HPLO	12:29	Noted
VI.	OLD BUSINESS	<p>A. Legal Counsel Report – Robert Weinberg, Assistant Attorney General reported that Bill 102-36: requires livestreaming for Board Meetings. HPLO has been working on technical solutions. This Bill's new requirement for Agendas to be published in advance of scheduled meetings.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> No last minute changes due to 5-day notice. Purpose is to provide advance notice to the Public; Agenda could be amended at the scheduled meeting under Item II. Adoption of Agenda. Need to address whether names should be listed on published Agenda, as each Board handle items differently. Suggested that under Complaints, names of Complainant and Licensee be not listed and standardized for all Boards, (i.e. names remain unlisted during the course of the investigation). Special Meetings required staying on the agenda topics and not discuss matters unrelated. Fiscal Report may be required to be broadcasted; however, could be cost prohibitive. HPLO could use Live Streaming via webpage Workgroup has been looking at the Law; currently reviewing Texas Law and should consider addressing it and using it in our local Statue on subjects such as: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Veterinarian Record Keeping Provision for Temporary Licensure Inactive Licensure Removal of Collaborative Practice Agreement, e.g. Prescriptive Authority Executive Sessions regarding pending cases against Licensees. Some Boards are mandated to handle complaints in Executive Session, while other Board's, such as the GBAHE, do not have that authority. Challenge finding legal representations for cases, such as those filed against local Veterinarians On Chiropractor Case: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Cease and Desist Letter initiated to be served on one unlicensed "chiropractor" based on information from the social media, at an establishment called "Le Balance." Another matter is on a local Chiropractor going off-island and leaving another "Chiropractor" from California to take charge of her clinic to see patients, who is not licensed on Guam. Dr. Miller said that he is in the process of determining whether treatment was actually provided based on appointment log. Noted that a Complaint file will be filed with this Board. Procurement of Investigators: A necessity to have investigators complete pending investigations and provide recommendations or disposition to the Board for consideration. 	OAG	12:32	Noted

Letter from Senator Telena Nelson on Exemption of Licensure <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Asst AG Weinberg provided an overview of the letter for a request for an exemption or emergency /temporary licensure to an Oregon Intern under supervision with an Oregon licensed Psychologist as of October 2020. Determined that the individual “therapist” in question, who was providing CBT sessions to a child diagnosed with OCD, would not have met qualifications for licensure; however, if the Oregon licensed psychologist with a Psy.D. was to get licensed on Guam, then the “therapist” concerned could be supervised by the licensed psychologist. HPLO, twice, sent the psychologist an Application for Licensure; but as of date, no Application was received. Ass’t AG Weinberg alerted the Board to anticipate increasing situations of this nature due to Telemedicine and Tele-health practices, such as supervision of “interns” off-island when the patient is on-island.
