already established in a high school setting," said Rabago. "A lot of these girls haven't traveled or played volleyball off-island within the last few years. So for them to go out there and play was a big eye opener for them — what to expect next year."

Guam's volleyball teams also gave service by either donating clothes or kids' toys to charities or bringing money to buy snacks for the needy in all different age groups.

Result

As all six Guam teams were defeated by the Philippines, each of the top Guam teams from the public schools and private schools — the Islanders and Royals — competed for the overall third and fourth place.

On the third day of the tournament, the Royals took victory against the Islanders, taking third place overall. The Royals won the second, fourth and fifth sets at 26-24, 26-24, and 15-11. First place was taken by the Philippines' Adamson University, ADU, along with Far Eastern University, FEU, as second.

"For the JFK Team, constructively, from the season until the off-island tournament, we still needed to build on the foundation of consistency. We have so much to work, build and improve on as a team, especially closing offsets," said Islanders junior Lyca Alves.

Experience

Alves also took the time to share her volleyball experiences in the Philippines.

"ADU, FEU, and (King's Montessori School) were more advanced, fast-paced, skilled, and three times taller than us, with no mer-

cy at all," said Alves. "What worked was the yearly training they had, according to one of the players from there, and their evident teamwork."

St. John's sophomore Ava Ouhadi said similarly to Alves, which also motivated her and her team.

"They were all really good and I think that inspired a lot of us to work harder when we got back," Ouhadi said.

Alves showed her amazement at the way ADU and FEU cheered and chanted for their teammates on the court throughout the entire game. She believes such

cheering would make girls volleyball games more entertaining.

Then Alves discussed her team's pep talk before

their match against ADU on the second day of the tournament, which encouraged teamwork.

"It was whether we as a team put in our best efforts on the court... hustling and working and cheering on our teammates. It was about what the team's cards would deal with," said Alves.

"I learned that preparation, execution on the

court, and confidence, even if you're eighteen points behind in a set, ties in with teamwork, and it will be evident whether you were

a starter, a sub, or benched throughout the whole set," said Alves.

Ouhadi shared her exciting feelings about the experiences during this one-week trip.

"Although playing volleyball was fun, I would say the most enjoyable aspect of the trip was just being able to bond with the players of the team. Whether

it was at dinner, shopping, or hanging out in our hotel rooms, we were always with one another," said Ouhadi.

Ouhadi also mentioned her grateful feelings towards all the supporters behind their volleyball trip.

"I want to thank coach Shep and coach Arvin, sensei Shepherd and the parents who came on the trip for making it enjoyable for all of us," said Ouhadi.
