three-tenths of a second in strike range.

In the 200-meter sprint, Lakena Gallardo of Guam High and Olivia Haddock of George Washington are the only two sprinters with entry times under 28 seconds, and there are four others under 29 seconds.

Gallardo and Haddock are also neck and neck in the 400-meter run and in the 800-meter run, GW's Gwenizah Barcinas still has the fastest qualifying time

at 2 minutes, 42.74 seconds.

While Guam High's Kiera Paz is still among the top three in the 800-meter, she is well ahead of the back in the distance races, the 1,500- and 3,000-meter runs.

Castro still owns the fastest qualifying times in both hurdle races, and Guam High and Simon Sanchez are 1-2 in the 4x400 relay, and Guam High has two combinations of sprinters under 54 seconds in the 4x100 meter relay.

Boys division

In the boys division, Guam High's Aaron John-

son is still the fastest high school athlete on Guam until proven otherwise.

He and Dean Masnayan from Tiyan High are the only two under 12 seconds in the 100-meter, and Johnson is well ahead of the field in the 200- and 400-meter runs going into the All-Island.

JFK's Hugh Kent is still lengths and laps ahead of the field in distance events, and Guam High still has the fastest qualifying times in the relays.

Jhavin Maniebo of Southern High School enters All-Island with the best shot put and second-best

discus throw, and JFK's distance runner Isaac Valdez is the only qualifier past 37 meters.

John's leap in the long jump is more than a half-meter past Masnayan's best qualifying long jump, and FD's Dylan Francisco is his school's best chance for a top podium finish in the triple jump.

The public is invited to the All-Island meet, set for today only at the JFK track.

A nominal admission fee is charged.
