Triton-KFC hoops returns Tuesday

The University of Guam Triton-KFC Men’s Basketball League returns for its fall of 2022 season Tuesday night at the UOG Calvo Field House with a double-header.

Six teams will go head-to-head in the league, including the defending champions, the MVP Stars, according to a release from UOG’s Triton Athletics. Other teams set to play are the KFC Bombers, UOG Tritons, Team OG, the Four Stars and MicroFriends.

“This is considered the best basketball league on the island and we have a waiting list every year of

teams who want to play in the league,” Doug Palmer, UOG athletic director said in the release.

The KFC Bombers from Andersen Air Force Base have won two championships in the league, but the MVP All-Stars won the most recent championship in spring 2022 with the Bombers finishing runner-up, according to the release.

“Everyone works to beat the Bombers and MVP; they set the standard for the league and feature some of the best players on the island,” Palmer said in the release.

Games will follow FIBA rules, with four 10-minute

quarters, the clock stopping on all whistles and a 24-second shot clock, according to the release.

The league’s season begins with the KFC Bombers facing the MicroFriends at 6:30 p.m., followed by the Tritons taking on Team OG, according to the release. The Tritons-Team OG game will be broadcast on PBS Guam.

The PBS games will feature play-by-play commentary by Fred Peters, the coach at St. John’s School, and Argie Flores, a former player in the league who will provide color, according to the release.

The league championship is set for Dec. 5.
