The Warriors have arguably the league's most dominant player at the net in Rui Ventura, a lefty who hits on his strong side playing opposite on the court. Ventura has the skillset to completely swing momentum and take over a game as he did on Tuesday to avoid getting swept. As St. John's setter Aidan Johnson put it, "the best way to

stop Rui Ventura is to make sure he doesn't get a good set, because when they get that perfect pass — he's a great hitter, hard to stop. That's how they won that one game."

The Warriors have a smart setter in Raven Pascual, complemented by middle hitters who know their role and attack the quick sets regularly. They have decent defense and they are one of the taller teams in a sport that rewards height naturally.

"You know, we are a real-

ly good team. but I think we just seem to procrastinate at the end. That's something we really need to work on," said Nathan Hodges, who plays on the soft-spoken side despite having one of the heaviest hands on the court. "We just need to have more trust in ourselves and believe that we can win. I really think that we can become champions this season."

On Monday night, the Harvest Christian Academy Eagles gave the Father Duenas Memorial School

Friars their first loss, winning against a squad that did not have Ethan Alvarez and a couple of other key players in the lineup. In the only other game Tuesday night, the Notre Dame Royals blanked the Guam High Panthers.

The IIAAG season officially hits the midway point on Friday when the Knights head south to take on the Notre Dame Royals, and the FD Friars visit the Warriors at St. Paul.
