	a) Application(s) for Full Licensure: (1) Nicole D. Collett. The GBME received a letter from INS and verified that the applicant provided a copy of her green card to work in the US; therefore, the application is now complete. 	(2) John D. Gherman. The Chair reported MI provided the physician with an unrestricted license in June 2022 upon his completion of a probationary period, where the physician was required to participate in a substance abuse treatment program and monitoring period. (a) Although the GBME recognized he completed MI requirements, the GBME expressed several concerns in approving his application at this time: Guam currently does not have an impaired professional treatment and monitoring program in place to provide necessary supports and it would take some time before a program is in-place; additional stressors moving to Guam that could increase risk of regression; his past history of illegal use of prescription medications to self-medicate and access to such prescription medications as a physician. (b) Asst AG Weinberg stated that there are several programs available in the community for those similarly situated, which are mandated by the court that could be available which provide support, e.g., Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, etc., where proof of attendance is required. In some jurisdictions, physicians are required to sign contracts. In addition, he stated that there are many other sectors in the community that have similar challenges, so other professionals should be considered in an impaired professional treatment and monitoring program			Approved Course of Action; Assigned to P. 	<p>(c) P. Flores stated that the physician is currently lacking the requirement number for CMEs. He also suggested that the physician should be requested to propose what monitoring steps could be taken to minimize the risk of relapsing. He also recommended that the GBME postpone a decision on the application in lieu of disapproving it; this approach would also allow him to address the status of the required CMEs. Dr. Cruz suggested the physician should be given the opportunity to propose a plan on how he could be monitored in lieu of having to wait until Guam establishes a program. Dr. Bortallo stated that employment and re-entering medical practice is also part of the recovery process and suggested that GBHWC could be required to conduct periodic testing.</p> <p>(d) Dr. Adolphson supported having a monitoring program in place, which could potentially be done via telemedicine. Flores and herself, where she highlighted concerns that are contrary to the proposed wording: those accused are innocent until proven guilty; it would be difficult to administer; it would be unfair and unjust to the profession. P. Flores supported her summary and recommended that the GBME take a position against the proposal, and the Chair agreed.</p> <p>The Chair also stated that, since it was his understanding that a main concern was number of complaints pending and the lengthy process to close cases, the GBME has since closed a number of cases, significantly reducing the total number of open cases.</p> <p>Asst AG Weinberg stated that the proposed wording is currently flawed since it fails to define accusation. He stated complaints need to be thoroughly investigated to determine if formal accusations are warranted. Dr. Bordallo stated that most cases would most likely take more than six months to resolve. Although GBME adheres to confidentiality during the investigation, complainants often disclose information to the public via social media, the media, which often leads to premature conclusions that stir controversy publicly. She stated that a waiver of the HIPAA rights should be taken into consideration in the overall discussion.</p> <p>In response to Dr. Bordallo's question regarding NPDB, Asst AG Weinberg stated that federal guidelines dictate what could be published in the NPDB; therefore, failure to adhere could expose the GBME members to be personally liable through civil suits. Normally, what is allowed to be published is the disciplinary action taken by the board; however, legal review prior to posting is NPDB is suggested.</p> <p>Although the draft Bill focuses on transparency, due process is necessary. # Diaz chokes out Ferguson to win UFC 279

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Nate Diaz stopped Tony Ferguson with a guillotine choke in the fourth round of the hastily arranged main event of UFC 279 on Saturday night.

The 37-year-old Diaz (21-13) finished his current UFC contract by finishing fellow veteran Ferguson (25-9) in a matchup only made on Friday after

Khamzat Chimaev badly missed weight for his main-event bout with Diaz. Chimaev stopped Kevin Holland with a D'Arce choke 2:13 into the first round of their grudge match, which was also created after Chimaev (12-0) missed weight by 7 1/2 pounds on Friday morning. The UFC dramatically shuffled its card to keep

both Chimaev and Diaz on the show, resulting in three new matchups for the final three fights at T-Mobile Arena.

Diaz's desire to fight the vaunted Chimaev seemed foolhardy in a distinctly Diaz way, but the late matchup with Ferguson was much more competitive than the original booking likely would have been.

Ferguson, who only agreed to be on the card three weeks ago, had lost his previous four fights over the past three years, while Diaz was 1-2 in the last six years.


