Methodology: Unlike previous surveys issued via mail, PIHOA procured contractors to assist in the data collection of primary care providers to identify eligible and ineligible physicians. She is currently working with providers in the community, such as FHP, AMC, and SDA. In addition, she has been working with HPLO in identifying any new physicians applying for a National Provider Identifier and reviewing the existing list of licensees maintained by HPLO. Board members: expressed concerns of the possibility of over-counting the FTEs or mis-classifying the physicians and suggested interviews directly with the providers to obtain a more accurate accounting since physicians in Guam work at multiple locations and may not be working full-time (e.g., place of practice needs to be determined); suggested a census vice a survey may be more appropriate; physicians could mistakenly be mis-classified, etc. The GBME offered its assistance to: a. review the current list of eligible/ineligible physicians and provide input b. widely disseminate the survey to the Guam Medical Society and the Guam Medical Association via mass email c. add pertinent survey questions to the new/renewal licensure application process. d. NOTE: Dr. Aguon informed the Board that GMHA is in the process of establishing an Out-patient Clinic 3. Schedule: Dr. Techur-Pedro stated that the survey is anticipated to be completed by November 2023. By next week, the bulk of the work is anticipated to be completed; to date, information has been obtained for 115 physicians. 4. Confidentiality: Dr. Techur-Pedro stated the MOUs are being established to ensure the protection of shared information. a. P. Asst AG Weinberg stated that patients seeking related off-island treatment that what they are receiving in Guam, then the physician must be licensed in Guam in order to provide consultation, otherwise, he/she must consult with the physician of the patient. 5. P. Flores suggested that there should be some verbiage in agreements between providers for any consultation for post-operative care, etc. by a non-Guam license physician clearly specify the patient's physician to be consulted. Dr. Adolphson stated that she believes the referral packets arranged by the insurance companies appears to be in-place; however, in her specific case, the consultation provided was a clear violation of law. Dr. David stated that Dr. Adolphson's case is a clear example of why an outreach to the community is essential, so that the policy could eventually be self-enforcing. Dr. Cruz stated that it is important to inform the insurance companies of the violation especially for potential reimbursement of telemedicine consultation. Dr. Aguon informed the Board that not all outpatient telemedicine consultation is reimbursable, and could be discussion of the GBME at a later date. 	b. Dr. Berg stated that it is difficult for the GBME to closely scrutinize an applicant's ability to perform			
	medical care in accordance with USA standards for applicants, who are not practicing or have not			
	practiced in the USA for a number of years. In the past, he recalls the Board requiring applicants, who			
	have not been practicing in the USA for more than two to three years, to obtain a secondary assessment			
	(c.g., PACE) on their competency in their respective field and that this approach is recognized by the			
	FSMB and required of other states. Dr. Berg stated that the GBME, at its discretion, is able to establish			

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	and implement standard criteria before issuing licensure. c. In reference to the GBME's review of applicants, who have practiced in non-US recognized facilities, Dr. David stated that she would support a non-discriminatory and consistent approach that would apply to all licensure applicants, who have similar circumstances. Upon her read of the 10 GCA, Chapter 12, 12205, the law does not specify the requirement to have practiced in USA for a number of years in order to be eligible for licensure.		3	
	 d. Dr. Aguon stated that the Board should consider relying on the evaluation systems in place at the local hospitals to determine and validate one's competency to ensure the standard of care, e.g., for GMHA it requires a Focus Professional Practice Evaluation. Since Guam needs physicians with specific specialties, she is concerned that they may opt to apply elsewhere if they are required to demonstrate competency by a third party in order to apply for licensure in Guam. e. P. Flores suggested contacting the concerned practice facilities to determined how they have vetted the 			
	applicants. He, therefore, inquired if the PI have similar NPDB-like equivalent system. Dr. David stated that there is no equivalent system in the PI that collects data across specialties and monitors practice performance; however, there are two national entities that keep track of who is license and those licensees who participate in the insurance system, respectively. f. Dr. Cruz suggested that, if the qualifications is not specified in the law, then it should be clarified and
