Most of the states on the database consider the use of tattoo removal lasers as a medical procedure and in a number of them, they require the use of these devices be done by a healthcare professional or under direct supervision of a physician. Additionally, A. David reached out to the FDA, as the FDA regulates laser devices for the removal of tattoos and noted, the lasers are cleared for use by or under the supervision of a healthcare professional. Lastly, A. David consulted with Dr. Steven Yang, a board certified dermatologist practicing in Guam and is considered an expert in the use of a variety of lasers for cosmetic procedures. Dr. Yang noted, the type of laser in questions is not a Class 2 laser, as the letter from the manufacturer indicated, but rather is a Class 4 laser and is considered a medical device. Dr. Yang also indicated that these lasers have the potential to cause blindness, permanent eye damage, and significant skin damage, including burns, if not used appropriately.
