		 a) Application(s) for Full Licensure: (1) Nicole D. Collett. The GBME received a letter from INS and verified that the applicant provided a copy of her green card to work in the US; therefore, the application is now complete. The GBME agreed to approve the application with the understanding that the physician will be requested to provide the GBME/HPLO with an update of her INS status in June 2023. 		 (2) John D. Gherman. The Chair reported MI provided the physician with an unrestricted license in June 2022 upon his completion of a probationary period, where the physician was required to participate in a substance abuse treatment program and monitoring period. (a) Although the GBME recognized he completed MI requirements, the GBME expressed several concerns in approving his application at this time: Guam currently does not have an impaired professional treatment and monitoring program in place to provide necessary supports and it would take some time before a program is in-place; additional stressors moving to Guam that could increase risk of regression; his past history of illegal use of prescription medications to self-medicate and access to such prescription medications as a physician. (b) Asst AG Weinberg stated that there are several programs available in the community for those similarly situated, which are mandated by the court that could be available which provide support, e.g., Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, etc., where proof of attendance is required. In some jurisdictions, physicians are required to sign contracts. In addition, he stated that there are many other sectors in the community that have similar challenges, so other professionals should be considered in an impaired professional treatment and monitoring program 			Approved Course of Action; Assigned to P Flores.

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	(c) P. Flores stated that the physician is currently lacking the requirement number for CMEs. He also suggested that the physician should be requested to propose what monitoring steps could be taken to minimize the risk of relapsing. He also recommended that the GBME postpone a decision on the application in lieu of disapproving it; this approach would also allow him to address the status of the required CMEs. Dr. Cruz suggested the physician should be given the opportunity to propose a plan on how he could be monitored in lieu of having to wait until Guam establishes a program. Dr. Bordallo stated that employment and re-entering medical practice is also part of the recovery process and suggested that GBHWC could be required to conduct periodic testing.			
	(d) Dr. Adolphson supported having a monitoring program in place, which could potentially be done via telemedicine. Dr. David stated that one of the challenges with telemedicine is the time difference; however, working with HI could be a better option. In addition, Dr. David stated that the GBME could start with GBHWC since it has access to grant funding and technical assistance from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration. The Chair also stated that he would address the issue with the HPLO Administrator in preparation for their discussions with a tri-regulatory group in October 2022, which addresses medical, nursing and pharmaceutical issues.			
	(e) The GBME agreed to continue to brainstorm and map-out what an impaired physician treatment and monitoring program would look like and how soon one could be implemented.			
	(f) Based on the above discussion, motion to approve P. Flores to contact the physician in accordance with the following course of action before deciding on his application (Dr. Berg; 2 nd ; P. Flores):

	(f) Discussion of Bill No. 317-36 (COR) (l) "AN ACT TO AMEND § 12212.1 OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 12, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PUBLIC DISCLOSURE OF PHYSICIAN PROFILES." Dr. David provided an overview of the proposed legislation presented at a public hearing, which was attended by P. Flores and herself, where she highlighted concerns that are contrary to the proposed wording: those accused are innocent until proven guilty; it would be difficult to administer; it would be unfair and unjust to the profession. P. Flores supported her summary and recommended that the GBME take a position against the proposal, and the Chair agreed. The Chair also stated that, since it was his understanding that a main concern was number of complaints pending and the lengthy process to close cases, the GBME has since closed a number of cases, significantly reducing the total number of open cases. Asst AG Weinberg stated that the proposed wording is currently flawed since it fails to define accusation. He stated complaints need to be thoroughly investigated to determine if formal accusations are warranted. Dr. Bordallo stated that most cases would most likely take more than six months to resolve. Although GBME adheres to confidentiality during the investigation, complainants often disclose information to the public via social media, the media, which often leads to premature conclusions that stir controversy publicly. She stated that a waiver of the HIPAA rights should be taken into consideration in the overall discussion. In response to Dr. Bordallo's question regarding NPDB, Asst AG Weinberg stated that federal guidelines dictate what could be published in the NPDB; therefore, failure to adhere could expose the GBME members to be personally liable through civil suits. Normally, what is allowed to be published is the disciplinary action taken by the board; however, legal review prior to posting is NPDB is suggested. Dr. David provided an overview of the proposed changes to the legislation. The GBME supported the following positions: Receptive to increase the number of public members (NOTE: The Federation of State Medical Boards currently require at least 20% to be public members). Oppose any reduction to the number of physicians, for numerous reasons, e.g., maintain a range of expertise across disciplines, need for medical professionals to deal with licensure Keep an odd number of board members to avoid ties in decision-making Maintain current wording on terms since it is extremely difficult to recruit volunteers to participate on the board NOTE: The Chair reported that the Guam Medical Society and the Guam Medical Association established their positions to oppose the proposed changes.
