
Rosemary and I met late September with representatives from the University of Guam (UOG) and the Department of Labor (DOL) to address concerns regarding testing availability for Nurse Aide Certification. This is a quick summary of what was discussed.

Currently the HPLO provides testing as needed so a constant annual schedule did not exist. In addition, the HPLO tested an average of 5 – 10 students per testing cycle. Today, we are receiving greater than 30 applications at any one time. An unpredictable increase that caught the HPLO off guard. Today, only one (1) fte is allocated to the nursing board. Staffing must be taken into consideration as it is a huge barrier that will have to be addressed at the Public Health level.

In addition, we mapped out the application to testing process, several gaps were identified that could definitely use improvement. The following organizations require our service. It is imperative that an action plan be developed in order to meet the communities needs.

- 1. Guam Marianas Training Center (GMTC)
 - a. 3 cycles (4-month course)
 - b. Exams (April, July, October)
 - c. Total students per cycle = 15/20

 - d. Placed on GBNE Agenda December 12, 2019
 - e. Exam (written and clinical) December 20 and 21, 2019 (April, July, Oct, Jan)
 - f. Exam Results January 24, 2019
 - g. Total students per cycle = 20
- 3. Guam High School
 - a. 1 cycle
 - b. Exam scheduled for April every year
 - c. Total students per cycle = 18/20
- 4. Catholic Social Service
 - a. Absorbed into GMTC
 - b. Exam Open....
 - c. Total students per cycle = 15/20



- 5. Guam Community College
 - a. 2 cycles (5-month program twice a year)
 - b. Exams in May and December (move to January and July or provide additional test month)
 - c. Total students per cycle = 10/15


Action Plan:

- 6. Quarterly meetings with stake holders. Zennia to schedule.
- 7. Provide application process in the GBNE website. Rosemary to work with the board members to build.

US officials to give depositions in impeachment probe

cials who had been asked to testify in the impeachment investigation of U.S. President Donald Trump have agreed to provide depositions, an official with a Democratic-led House of Representatives committee said on Tuesday.

Former U.S. Ambassador to Ukraine Marie Yovanovitch will give a deposition on Oct. 11, according to the committee official who spoke on condition of anonymity. Trump's former special representative for Ukraine, Kurt Volker, will appear before the panel on Thursday, the official said.

Following a whistleblower complaint last week, Democrats are looking into Trump's request to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy during a July 25 phone call to investigate a domestic political rival, former Vice President Joe Biden. Biden is a leading Democratic contender in the contest to run against Republican Trump in the 2020 election.

The unidentified whistleblower is said to be an intelligence agent who accused Trump of soliciting foreign interference for his personal political benefit.

Earlier on Tuesday, U.S. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo pushed back on House Democrats' efforts to get the

depositions from State Department officials, accusing the lawmakers of bullving and intimidation.

The officials "may not attend any interview or deposition" without executive branch counsel present to control disclosure of confidential information. Pompeo wrote in a letter to House Foreign Affairs Committee Chairman Eliot Engel.

Engel and two other Democratic committee chairmen issued a statement accusing Pompeo of "stonewalling" the impeachment inquiry, and called him a "fact witness" in the investigation, based on media reports that he had listened in on Trump's call with Zelenskiy.

"He should immediately cease in timidating department witnesses in order to protect himself and the president," Engel and Representatives Adam Schiff and Elijah Cummings said.

There was no immediate word on whether three other officials had agreed to requests to appear before the committees. They are Deputy Assistant Secretary of State George Kent, State Department Counselor T. Ulrich Brechbuhl and U.S. Ambassador to the European Union Gordon Sondland.

The State Department did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

Johnson & Johnson settles Ohio opiod suits

(Reuters) - Johnson & Johnson said on Tuesday it will pay \$20.4 million to settle claims by two Ohio counties, allowing the U.S. health care giant to avoid an upcoming federal trial seeking to hold the industry responsible for the nation's opioid epidemic.

J&J became the fourth drugmaker to settle claims ahead of the federal court trial against multiple manufacturers and distributors in Cleveland scheduled for later this month. The case is considered a bellwether for more than 2,600 lawsuits by state and local governments that are pending nationally.

"The settlement allows the company to avoid the resource demands and uncertainty of a trial as it continues to seek meaningful progress in addressing the nation's opioid crisis," J&J said in a statement.

"The company recognizes the opioid crisis is a complex public health challenge and is working collaboratively to help communities and people in need," it added.

Opioids were involved in 400,000 overdose deaths in the United States from 1999 to 2017, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.


