Subject: Waiver for Clinical Practice Requirement - Guam Marianas Training Center (GMTC)

Dear Guam Board of Nurse Examiner (GBNE),

The Guam Marianas Training Center (GMTC) humbly submits a waiver request for the clinical practice requirement associated with our approved Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) course.


The COVID-19 pandemic has created many challenges within the medical system. The ongoing curtailed standard operating practices throughout the medical arena has caused significant impact as we cope with addressing immediate concerns.

Therefore, GMTC is requesting approval to conduct our CNA clinical practice requirement in-house versus outside facilities. The students usually perform clinical sessions at either Saint Dominic's Senior Care Home (SDSCH), the Skilled Nursing Unit (SNU), or the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA); halted was this procedure due to the pandemic.

Recently, GMHA announced starting student clinical sessions with additional requirements. Although having the ability to conduct the clinical practice at an approved outside facility is encouraging, it does not address the continual concerns associated with the pandemic. A realistic fear is related to contracting the virus when being placed into a higher risk category. Students also have the option not to participate due to the higher risk of contracting COVID-19. The legality of a student not having COVID-19 and contracting during student clinical sessions is unable to be assessed as to who may be responsible.

The Guam Marianas Training Center (GMTC) facility is equipped and prepared to conduct student clinical sessions in-house while adhering to the established protocols of mask usage and social distancing. Our projected clinical schedule is for July 13 - 17, 20, 22 - 24, and will be from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. each day.

Annual Report to the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners

June 30, 2019 – June 30, 2020

Associate of Science in Practical Nursing program

Student Achievement of Program Outcomes

The Associate of Science in Practical Nursing (ASPN) program received initial approval to implement the program from the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners (GBNE) effective on July 26, 2019. We began the first ASPN cohort with 20 students. Most of the ASPN students completed the summer session with a Dosage Calculations course as well as a one credit lab component for Anatomy & Physiology. Some students received prior credit from UOG for the aforementioned courses and thus did not need to take the summer session courses. Every student successfully met the requirements of the summer session and moved on to the official start of the NU level courses in the Fall 2019 semester.

The Fall semester began on August 14th and ended November 26th. The Practical Nursing students took NU110 Nursing Foundations and NU160 Pharmacology courses. Clinical rotations for the NU110 course were conducted at Guam Memorial Hospital's Skilled Nursing Unit. All 20 students successfully completed 180 hours of laboratory/clinical practice and 60 hours of didactic instruction, learning fundamental skills for nursing practice. Additionally, on November 3, 2019, the students participated in the GCC College outreach and recruitment event hosted at the Micronesia Mall. The students participated in the fair by conducting wellness checks and vital signs.

The Spring 2020 semester began on January 5th with 20 students enrolled. During this semester, the students took NU220 Adult Medical Surgical Nursing, NU230 Maternal Newborn Concepts & Skills and NU240 Pediatric Nursing Concepts & Skills. The students began Medical Surgical Nursing clinicals at GMH's medical surgical and surgical units on February 20th, 2020. They completed a total of 93 contact hours of lab/clinical practice prior to the Governor's declaration of a Public Health State of Emergency as a result of COVID 19. The students had approximately 48 hours left to complete their clinical hours for NU220. In an effort to complete the remaining hours, and also to respond to the Governor's call for action for all health care personnel, our students volunteered and worked in various sites with DPHSS for COVID-19.

As a result of COVID-19, the program was unable to initiate any Maternal Newborn or Pediatric clinicals. PN faculty have reached out to our clinical partners to complete clinicals at FHP's Pediatrics clinic and Dr. Sheih's clinic, DPHSS maternal & pediatric clinics and Guam Memorial Hospital to complete the remaining clinical hours for Maternal Newborn and Pediatric clinicals. Students will be starting their Pediatric and Maternal health clinicals at FHP and Dr. Sheih's clinic on June 22, 2020. We anticipate we will be able to complete all clinical requirements before the first week of August.

We would like to recognize our students who did not hesitate to step up to the Governor's call for action. They received experience assessing, screening, monitoring and testing individuals for COVID-19 at various locations such as the Guam International Airport, Port Authority, Quarantine & Isolation sites, DPHSS clinics and COVID outreach sites. We were impressed by

their willingness to respond and their ability to adjust to frequent changes during this unprecedented time.

Positions & Faculty

Currently, the Nursing & Allied Health Department has a Nursing & Allied Health Administrator, two FTE faculty, one administrative assistant and one adjunct faculty to manage the program. **Dorothy-Lou M. Duenas, MSN, RN** is the Nursing & Allied Health Administrator.


The lead program faculty is **Assistant Professor Rosemary Loveridge, MSN, RN**. She taught NU110, Nursing Foundations, NU220 Medical Surgical Nursing and NU230 Maternal Newborn Concepts & Skills lectures, laboratory practice and clinicals. Instructor, **William Eric Lee MSN, RN**, taught a few lectures for NU110 Nursing Foundations and NU220 Medical Surgical Nursing and was the faculty member for NU110, NU220 & NU240 Pediatric laboratory/clinical practice.

We have recently hired another full-time faculty member, **Loressa Melegrito, RN, BSN**. She was the lead faculty for NU110, NU220, NU230 Maternal Newborn Concepts & Skills and NU240 Pediatric concepts laboratory and clinical practice. She facilitated the coordination of laboratory skills practice and clinical schedules for each course. We welcome her back to our team. Lastly, adjunct faculty, **Lucy Joo-Castro, MSN, RN**, taught the lecture portion of NU160 Pharmacology and NU240 Pediatric Concepts. She is currently working on her DNP, but continues to support the PN students through mentorship.

Conclusion

The Department is committed to ensuring the success of our students and our faculty for the Associate of Science in Practical Nursing Program. Continuous assessment, advisement and evaluation practices have been implemented for our students and faculty. Each course currently utilizes ATI assessment to enhance NCLEX-PN preparation with online case studies and diagnostic tests provided at the beginning and end of each course. Additionally, the department purchased Kaplan online learning programs to assist students as they progress into the final semester of the program this fall. This learning resource will provide students with additional NCLEX-PN practice questions and rationales to assess their progress and readiness for the NCLEX-PN exam. We are pleased with the progress of our students thus far and are committed to supporting our students toward their completion of the program and passing of the NCLEX-PN exam for licensure.

Subject: **ASPN Program Clinical Hours and Resumption of courses for Fall 2020**

On March 14, 2020 the Governor declared for a Public Health Emergency (Executive Order No. 202-03) due to COVID-19. As a result of the pandemic many healthcare professionals most particularly nurses were activated to respond to the COVID crisis. The Associate of Science in Practical Nursing program faculty and students all responded to the call for activation and were assigned to various areas working for the Department of Public Health and Social Services as well as a few clinics such as the American Medical Clinic and Sagua Managu Clinic. Since of the start of the COVID pandemic the students and faculty have put in over 400 hours of clinic work in their respective areas.

The nursing faculty have been extremely mindful of the safety of our students. As a result, all of the students were able to be properly fit tested for the N95 mask and received refresher training re: donning and doffing PPEs. The faculty and administrator have remained in close communication with our students conducting frequent checks on them to assess their progress and also to ascertain for any issues or concerns.

While the ultimate goal is to have our students increase their clinical practice with experiences in the hospital, we understand that due to the COVID crisis many clinical opportunities regarding certain subjects are limited in order to decrease or prevent the possible exposure of COVID-19 to patients and students. Therefore, the faculty and administrator are requesting for your approval to accept at least 50% of the clinical hours that our students have already worked to be considered to be applicable towards their upcoming NU292 Medical Surgical Nursing clinical hours.

Additionally, the Department would like your consideration and approval for the modified plan attached for the PN courses for the Fall 2020 semester. Modifications will include an integration of simulation and cases study scenarios for certain clinical components, remote learning for lectures via google classroom, decreased class sizes for laboratory and clinical practice to meet COVID-19 guidelines so social distancing.

**Guam Community College ASPN Program
Curriculum Modification Plan
Response to COVID-19**

On June 24, 2020 Guam Community College submitted its plan for re-opening following Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero's declaration for Guam to move into PCOR-2, Executive Order 2020-14. GCC as well as the Associate of Science in Practical Nursing Program has established a plan that would fall in line with the established guidelines for COVID-19. The Nursing and Allied Health Department intends on implementing the following standards of practice to resume courses:

1. There will be a mix of remote learning via google classroom and in class face to face lectures/laboratory practice.
2. All students will be required to wear face masks to class for in person lectures and laboratory skills.
3. Social distancing requirements will be adhered to and temperatures will be taken each course day.
4. Lab courses will have a maximum of 6-7 students per classroom.
5. Equipment will be cleaned and sanitized before and after each course and laboratory practice session.
6. Students are discouraged from congregating in hallways or on campus. The requirement for social distancing will be adhered to.

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic the Associate of Science in Practical Nursing students have completed over 450 hours of work responding in various sites for the Department of Public Health and Social Services. With this in mind we are humbly asking for your consideration to count 50-75% or 90-135 contact hours for the clinical/lab component of their NU292 Medical Surgical course. The required hours for this course includes 30 hours of lecture and 180 hours of lab/clinical practice. If 135 hours is counted the students would have a remaining of 45 hours left for clinical practice. Clinical requests have been made to the Guam Memorial Hospital and Guam Regional Medical City.

***NU292 Nursing Practicum – 30 hours lecture, 180 hours lab/clinical**

- Request for 90-135 hours be counted as fulfilled related to COVID participation in COVID outreaches, airport screening, isolation and quarantine site work.

NU250 Mental Health Nursing – 30 hours lecture, 45 hours clinical

- Mix of remote learning via google classroom for lecture, online simulation and case studies.
- Clinical request will be submitted for 45 hours clinical practice to Guam Behavioral Health & Wellness.

NU280 Nursing Trends – 15 hours lecture

- 75% in person lecture, 15% remote learning

NU281 NCLEX-PN Review & Transition – 30 hours lecture

- 90% in person lecture/computer adaptive training, 10% remote lecture via online resources ie: Kaplan, ATI & UWorld.

Furthermore, the department requests for your approval to incorporate simulation experiences for their remaining Spring semester Maternal Newborn clinical hours. The students have approximately 20 hours remaining for this clinical course. Dr. Margaret Hattori-Uchima and Dr. Katherine Wood from the University of Guam School of Nursing & Health Science have graciously shared online simulation resources with our faculty to include as a component for clinical practice. If approved the faculty would follow the same clinical arrangement for simulation as recommended by the UOG faculty and the Dean. Five online simulations with a pre and post conferences for each simulation. Students will answer all case study questions with 90-100% accuracy and provide reflective journals to accompany the clinical simulation and case study exercises. If this request is not granted, we will request for clinical hours to be completed at DPHSS clinics for maternal child appointments.

As a result of the COVID pandemic the Nursing & Allied Health Department has taken additional measures to work closely with the University of Guam and the hospitals to ensure the availability for clinical practice is equally shared. We understand that we are now faced with additional restrictions due to the limits and precautions the COVID-19 pandemic has placed on the community and our program. We humbly ask for the board's consideration and guidance regarding alternatives to clinical practice/lecture so that our students will be able to complete all requirements in a timely manner. We look forward to your response and continued support.

RE: Force Majeure Notice

Given the unforeseeable circumstances of this global COVID-19 pandemic (as announced by the World Health Organization), where national and local governments are ordering businesses to shut down and implement other stringent measures to combat the spread of the disease and causing unprecedented impacts on businesses' ability to continue to operate, Pearson VUE is hereby providing official notice of a *force majeure* event under our operative agreements. SUMMARY & RECOMMENDATION

- 1.** After an extensive review of health care specialist (medic), corpsman and airman curricula and comparing it with a standard LPN/VN curriculum, significant differences in content were identified. These differences preclude granting an LPN/VN license to veterans specialized in these areas without additional practical/vocational nurse coursework and clinical experience.
- 2.** For veterans with training and experience as health care specialists (medics), corpsmen and airmen, civilian BON-approved LPN/VN programs should develop bridge programs that are based on individual assessments of each veteran and geared towards helping these individuals acquire the knowledge, skills and abilities needed to practice as an LPN/VN safely without repeating previously acquired content.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GUAM BOARD OF NURSE EXAMINERS:

WHEREAS, the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners (GBNE) is charged by law with the licensure and discipline of nurses, specifically, Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN); Registered Nurse (RN); Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN); and Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA); and

WHEREAS, there are times when a quorum of the GBNE is unable to meet to review and grant or deny applications for temporary work permits, licenses and CNA Certification; and

WHEREAS, the GBNE has the utmost faith in the abilities of its Executive Officer to carry out the duties set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the GBNE to delegate to the Executive Officer the authority to assist the Board in carrying out its duties with regard to approving applications for temporary work permits and licenses during those times when the GBNE is not in session;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners delegates to the Executive Officer, or designee, the authority to:

1. Review temporary work permit and licensure/certification renewal applications and applicant responses to screening questions and approve applications whose answers or additional information meet the internal staff guidelines for a temporary work permit as determined by the Board. Internal guidelines are subject to change.
2. Defer approval of any application where a disciplinary or criminal application history exists to the Board for review and approval.
3. Approve applications for temporary work permits for Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) that meet the requirements of 10 GCA §§ 12315 and 12322; and Article 4 of the GBNE Board Rules and Regulations.
4. Approve applications for temporary work permits for Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) that meet the requirements of 10 GCA §§ 12315 and 12322; and Article 4 of the GBNE Board Rules and Regulations.
5. Approve applications for temporary work permits for Registered Nurse (RN) that meet the requirements of 10 GCA §§ 12310, 12311, and 12322 and Article 4 of the Board Rules.

6. Approve applications for temporary work permits for the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) that meet the requirements of 10 GCA §§ 12313 and 12322, and Article 5 of the Board Rules.
7. Approve applications for temporary prescriptive authority that meet the requirements of 10 GCA §§ 12313 and 12322, and Article 5.7 of the Board Rules.
8. Approve applications for Military Limited Volunteer Nursing license to a nurse (RN, LPN, APRN) that meet the requirements of 10 GCA § 12322(e).
9. Submit documentation to NURSYS and the National Practitioner Data Bank.
