Agencies, lawmakers discuss ways to reduce sexual violence

Officials from legal and law enforcement agencies gathered for a roundtable at the Guam Congress Building in Hagatña on Monday to discuss efforts to reduce criminal sexual conduct cases on the island.

The discussion was led by the legislative committee ovn justice.

During the hearing, the Guam Police Department reported a total of 1,282 cases involving criminal sexual conduct between 2017 and 2021.

Police Chief Stephen Ignacio said of those cases only 547 resulted in an arrest.

"It doesn't account for cases that were suspended due to insufficient probable cause for an arrest," said ignacio, who admitted the department does lack adequate personnel.

Committee chairwoman Speaker

Therese Terlaje questioned the disparity in hopes that the community can see that the difference in the number of cases versus the number of arrests isn't a result of "shoddy police work," adding that victims need to feel comfortable enough to speak out about their abuse.

"These are one of the cases where victims are hesitant to come forward," Ignaciosaid. "Eveniftheycome forward it is difficult for them to follow through to prosecute. We probably don't see many cases go to trial because victims don't want to get up there to testify on the stand. Those are the challenges."

Ignacio told senators he wants to revive a sex crimes unit within his department.

A major concern officials said they continue to notice is that many victims and abusers end up having close family ties.

"It's a little disturbing to have to

report that majority of our CSC cases involve family members. Either it's an uncle, stepdad, father, or grandfather," said Chief Prosecutor 8asil O'Mallan.

He admitted that at times the other adult in the household finds it difficult to leave the abuser for financial reasons.

"A big fear for mothers is to be homeless, and the only breadwinner is about to be locked up for a long time. I've encountered mothers who have that valid fear. We work with that," he said.

Multiple programs are in place to help victims of sexual abuse through the legal process and the healing process.

"Although in public it sounds like a slap in the hand or minimal kind of punishment (for the defendant), I see the victims relieved they don't have to get back on the stand and retell their story," said Joanne Agustin, an advocate with the attorney general's office, "A lot of times these cases, the perpetrators are family members. The victims have to muster up the courage to say something. Then to find out the lengthy legal process, a lot of times they are reluctant."



Pope lands in Canada on 'a trip of penance' for indigenous abuse

EDMONTON, Alberta (Reuters) - Pope Francis landed in Canada on Sunday to kick off a week-long trip that will center around his apology on behalf of the Roman Catholic Church for the abuse that indigenous children endured at mostly church-run residential schools.

'This is a trip of penance. Let's say that is its spirit," the pope told reporters after his flight took off from Rome.

The papal plane touched down in Edmonton in the western province of Alberta, where he will visit a former residential school and meet with indigenous peoples Monday. He is also visiting Quebec City and Iqaluit, the capital of the territory of Nunavut. He will depart Friday.

Between 1881 and 1996 more than 150,000 indigenous children were separated from their families and brought to residential schools. Many

The papal plane taxied with Canadian and Vatican flags flapping outside the cockpit windows. After disembarking with the help of a lift, the pope boarded a white Fiat 500X. which dropped him at the hangar. He then proceeded by wheelchair.

sion called "cultural genocide."

Governor General Mary Simon, who represents Canada's head of state, Queen Elizabeth, was the first to greet the pope. Canadian Prime Minister. Justin Trudeau followed.

The pope sat between the two Canadian officials for a short performance of four drummers and native singing before several indigenous leaders, many wearing elaborate headdresses, greeted and exchanged gifts with him.

"I asked today the pope to walk with us," Grand Chief George Arcand of the Confederacy of Treaty Six First Nations said in an interview with the Canadian Broadcasting Corp. "It was a very humbling experience to talk to your holiness."

RoseAnne Archibald, national chief for the Assembly of First Nations, who also greeted the pope, criticized the "unilateral" organization of the trip and the "archaic" nature of the church, which has no women in leadership positions.

"We don't feel that it has been about survivors" of residential schools, she told reporters at the airport. "It has been more about the church promoting the church's idea, fundraising for the church."

The pope left after the short ceremony in a wheelchair to speak for a few minutes in private with Trudeau and other officials before heading to St. Joseph Seminary, where he is expected to rest before Monday's

The 85-year-old pope canceled a trip to Democratic Republic of Congo and South Sudan in early July because of a knee problem that has recently forced him to use a wheelchair and a

Proposed Issuance of Underground Injection Control System Operating Permit DFS Guam Ltd.

Public Review and Comment Period: July 28, 2022 - August 26, 2022

The Guam Environmental Protection Agency (Guam EPA) runs the Underground Injection Control (UIC) Program, as mandated by the Safe Drinking Water Act, and approved by U.S. EPA.

The Agency regulates all applicable activities as set forth in the Guam's UIC Regulations. The UIC Program requires operating permits for all existing injection wells/systems. This includes wells built prior to the approval of the regulations are still in operation, and wells/ systems constructed after the effective date of the regulations.

Guarn EPA has received a renewal application from DFS Guam Ltd. for one injection system located at Comete Bidg., San Vitores Road, Tumon, Guam. The commericial building has offices, restaurants, stores, and aquarium with sub-surface drainage system at parking area.

On the basis of a preliminary UIC requirement review, the Administrator has proposed issuing a UIC permit to allow discharges of treated water from the aquarium and stormwater runoff from the parking lot into the injection

No industrial discharges or any discharges are allowed into the system.

The permit for this application will require:

Only treated water and stormwater runoff to be discharged into the injection system

2 - Monthly monitoring from the aquarium on certain parameters and semi-annual monitoring from parking lot of water quality for MBAS, Oil and Grease, NO3-N, Endrin, Lindane, Toxaphene, 2, 4-D, 2, 4, 5-TP Silvex, Heptachlor, Methoxychlor, Lead. Benzene, Ethylbenzene, Xylene, Toluene, MTBE, Boron, COD, and pH;

 Assurance regarding repairs, replacement, or abandonment of the system in the event of

A laboratory analysis report of treated and runoff water taken from the designated sampling point of the system; and

Compliance with other UIC requirements.

after the commenting period closes.
