

Håfa Adai Madam Speaker,

For the reasons provided below, Bill No. 356-37 (COR) will lapse into law without my signature.

My administration supports this legislation's general intent of expanding the pool of qualified licensed mental health professionals authorized to act as a clinical supervisor for those individuals studying to become licensed mental health professionals themselves. Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs) were excluded from those qualified licensed professionals who are allowed to supervise clinical hours for people seeking a license from the Board of Allied Health Examiners when the Boards regulations were updated in 2022.

Bill No. 356 recognizes the exacting standards necessary to qualify and serve as an LPC in Guam, and formally endorses their authority, along with clinical psychologists, psychiatrists, licensed clinical social workers, licensed mental health counselors, and marriage and family therapists, to serve as clinical supervisors for persons acquiring and completing clinical experience in psychology, counseling, or therapy. Becoming an LPC is indeed a rigorous process that requires extensive education, clinical experience and licensing requirements. These individuals are qualified to provide services to our community, including diagnosis and treatment of serious behavioral, emotional and mental health issues. It is entirely fitting and appropriate that they should be recognized to supervise the clinical work of aspiring mental health professionals.

While our administration supports the intent of this measure, the bill purports to amend rules and regulations, an Executive Branch function. As I have noted many times before, rulemaking and lawmaking are separate and distinct roles as provided by the Organic Act of Guam, which charges the Executive Branch with powers to issue "regulations" not in conflict with any applicable law, including Guam's rulemaking laws. Conversely, the Legislature is charged with drafting and passing "bills."

Bill No. 356-37's proposed amendments to Guam's Administrative Rules and Regulations infringe on well-established principles. While it is within the Legislature's authority to pass a bill containing the provisions in Bill No. 356-37, once the Legislature delegates rulemaking authority to an agency, as it has with the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiner, it must honor such delegation and not interfere with agency rulemaking unless the agency's rulemaking power is otherwise rescinded.

Noting this concern, Bill No. 356-37 will lapse into law as Public Law No. 37-142.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds

3 that § 10407 of the Administrative Rules and Regulations of the Guam Board of

Allied Health Examiners adopted in Public Law 36-138 do not list Licensed
 Professional Counselors (LPC) as an eligible Clinical Supervisor for Clinical
 Supervision via telehealth.


I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that § 10407 of the Guam Board of Allied Health
Examiners Administrative Rules and Regulations adopted in Public Law 36-138 is
in conflict with § 121301 of Article 13, Chapter 12, Title 10, GCA which delineates
rules for Licensed Professional Counselors to provide and obtain Clinical
Supervision.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that individuals seeking to become Licensed
Professional Counselors by obtaining clinical supervision via telehealth are now
facing barriers due to the exclusion of LPC in the list of eligible Clinical Supervisors
in §10407(d)(1) of the Administrative Rules and Regulations of the Guam Board of
Allied Health Examiners adopted in Public Law 36-138.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the requirements for clinical supervision are as stated in Rules and Regulations, §10407(d)(1). The requirements for in person/face-to-face clinical supervision remain consistent with those listed in Title 10 GCA (Health and Safety), Chapter 12, Article 13, §§ 121301, 121302, and 121303 regarding licensure for LPCs, LMHCs, and FMTs, as well as those specified in Rules and Regulations §10306(3) regarding licensure for Licensed Psychology Associates.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to ensure the Rules and
 Regulations of the Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners adopted in Public Law
 36-138 are consistent with Guam law by including Licensed Professional Counselors
 to the list of eligible professionals able to provide Clinical Supervision via telehealth.
 Section 2. § 10407(d)(1) of the Administrative Rules and Regulations of the
 Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners adopted in Public Law 36-138 is hereby
 amended to read as follows:

"(1) Clinical Supervisor Qualification. The clinical supervisor must
be a licensed professional counselor, licensed clinical social worker, licensed
mental health counselor, or marriage and family therapist, physically located
in Guam who has held a Guam license for a minimum of five (5) years with
direct experience in clinical work requiring diagnosis and treatment planning;
or a Clinical Psychologist or Psychiatrist licensed in Guam who has held a
license for a minimum of three (3) years."

8 Section 3. Retroactive Provision. This Act is intended to be applied 9 retroactively to December 28, 2022, and shall remain in effect upon enactment.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
